Ephesians 5:22-33. Wives & Husbands. Since we're to submit to one another out of respect for the Christ, wives are to submit to their husbands as well. The husband is in charge of the wife's safety, just as the Christ keeps the church body safe. Just as the church submits to the Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands, in everything.

Even more challenging, husbands are to love their wives just as the Christ loved the church, giving Himself up for her. He makes her holy; in fact, His word cleanses her, presents her as a radiant, wrinkle-free, stain-free bride—holy and blameless (see Revelation 19:7-8 for more about her wedding gown).

Similarly, husbands must love his wife as he loves himself. He cares and feeds his own body—just as the Christ does the church body—we are members of His body. So? A man will leave his parents and cling to his wife—the two will become one. What a profound mystery this is, but

## **EPHESIANS 5:22-33**

Wives, submit to your husbands as to the Lord.

<sup>23</sup>For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. <sup>24</sup>Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything.

<sup>25</sup>Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her <sup>26</sup> to make her holy, cleansing [or having cleansed] her by the washing with water through the word, <sup>27</sup> and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless. <sup>28</sup>In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. of course, I'm talking about Christ and the church. Each one of you must also love your wife, just as he loves himself, and the wife must respect her husband.

Ephesians 6:1-9. Children, Masters, Slaves. Similarly, children are to obey their parents in the Lord—this is the right thing to do. After all, it's one of the Ten Commandments and comes with a promise of long life. And, fathers, get off your high horse—don't exasperate your children—bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord God Yahweh.

Slaves obey your masters, respectfully and with fear, just as you would obey the Christ. Don't obey just to win your master's approval [ἀνθρωπάρεσκοι, menpleasers], but serve wholeheartedly, just as if you were serving the Lord God and not merely mortal men. The Lord will reward everyone for their good they do, regardless of their status as slave or free.

Finally, masters submit to your slaves in the same way. Don't threaten them—you know their true Master is Jesus the Christ in heaven; He's your actual master, and theirs. Christ doesn't play favorites!

**EPHESIANS 6:1-9** 

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. <sup>2</sup>"Honor your father and mother"—which is the first commandment with a promise—<sup>3</sup>"that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth."[Deuteronomy 5:16] <sup>4</sup>Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.

<sup>5</sup>Slaves, obey your earthly masters with respect and fear, and with sincerity of heart, just as you would obey Christ. <sup>6</sup>Obey them not only to win their favor when their eye is on you, but like slaves of Christ, doing the will of God from your heart. <sup>7</sup>Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not men, <sup>8</sup>because you know that the Lord will reward everyone for whatever good he does, whether he is slave or free.

<sup>9</sup>And masters, treat your slaves in the same way. Do not threaten them, since you know that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and there is no favoritism with him.
