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PASTORAL EPISTLES 5 THEOLOGICAL & EPISTEMOLOGICAL IMPLICATIONS

NTS 602 – Behavioral Objectives

TO COMPLETE SUCCESSFULLY THE NTS 601 FINAL EXAM, YOU WILL NEED TO...

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- 1. Identify the checklist Paul provides for selecting elders for the church, and identify those items which do not apply to deacons.
- 2. Discuss the significance of Paul's praise for Lois and Eunice, given his comments in 1 Corinthians 11:1-16, and 1 Corinthians 14:33-15; see also "Moody Radio Didn't Warn Me in Advance!" 1
- 3. Describe the three challenging areas Paul faced in the church at Ephesus: gnosticism [sic], decadent Judaism, and/or asceticism.
- 4. Be ready to discuss the differences and reasons for same undergirding the NIV and KJV translations of 1 Timothy 1:10 (ἀνδραποδισταῖς, $\underline{405}$).
- 5. Describe the nature of an elder's past as to how it can help and distract from said elder's ministry (1 Timothy 1:13-14).
- 6. Be able to compare Paul's ideas expressed in 1 Timothy 1:16 to those expressed in Romans 3:23-27²
- 7. Discuss why people get upset when people use a different noun for God than the English word for God?
- 8. Explain why Paul, also known as Saul, needed to stress he was telling the truth, not lying, as a teacher of Gentiles?
- 9. Summarize the advice given to Timothy regarding worship norms and modesty given in 1 Timothy 2:8-15.
- 10. Delineate which of the characteristics of elders/pastors/bishops are ideal versus finitely required.
- 11. Delineate which of the characteristics of deacons are ideal versus finitely required.
- 12. Discuss how the church is "the pillar and foundation of Truth." Then identify what aspects of truth the church overlooks the most.

²"...for all have sinned and **fall** short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. ²⁵God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished -26 he did it to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus."

- 13. Discuss the reasons why people drift away from "the faith." Then discuss what is the toughest part of "the faith" to stick to?
- 14. Explain the usefulness and ineffectiveness of universalism (1 Timothy 4:9-10).
- 15. Defend or critique the presumed sexism/misogyny of Paul in 1 Timothy 5:1-16).
- 16. Explain why elders who work in the word and teach are to be paid. Then discuss why we resist this notion. (1 Timothy 5:17-25)
- 17. Explore why slaves are to be good slaves (1 Timothy 6:1-10).
- 18. Discuss how one's faith can become hypocritical (2 Timothy 1:1-10)

Note: Additional Objectives will be added as we explore 2 Timothy, Titus, and Philemon.
