- A. Values brought to the debate/discussion
- B. Previous experience with politicians

- D. People hear/see what they want to hear/see (Porter's First Law of Human Behavior)1
- E. Values having nothing to do with picking a president (e.g., handsome/attractive)

Parallel Pedagogical Considerations—

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- A. We bring values, some positive, some negative to the teaching environment.
- B. Our students approach education colored by experience with previous teachers.
- C. Our students approach education colored by experience with us.
- D. Students hear and understand what they want to hear and understand.¹
- E. Students bring goals to the educational environment which have nothing to do with *Biblically driven* character and goals. For example...
 - 1. I need a degree to get the job I want.
 - 2. I really feel good when I am learning new stuff.
 - 3. Because I can learn more to feel superior to others.
 - 4. I need the status that comes with completing this course, this curriculum.
 - 5. This night, this time, this location was convenient.




Questions, Questions

- C. Cultural Toxicity:
 - Representation of the Pray often: the values your students bring to the class context can be toxic.
 - No Consider my experience with an atheist group to which I belong on Facebook. Contagious.


Persecuted Closer to the Lord God?

& We all want to be loved/recognized/appreciated by our students. Seduction indeed.

People's Baggage-

- A. The teacher is the boss; must be respected.
- B. I know more than the teacher, or I know nothing of value worthy of sharing.
- C. Their inerrant version of the Scripture.
- D. People bring their friend Art to class... the Cecil de Mille effect. Just a few examples...
 - ✓ Jesus as white with blue eyes.
 - ✓ Moses as a builder of pyramids.
 - ✓ Jesus as a carpenter (tekton, τέκτων).
 - ✓ David as selfless warrior for the Lord God.
 - ✓ Even translation bias...

 - ✓ Amen meaning "I agree" What does it mean IN Scripture?
 - ✓ English.
 - "in" for "ev" (εν)
 - 🖔 "you" and "you" mean the same
 - ℵ "Father" God for the Navajo
 - 8 "faith" meaning without any evidence, or as a collection of beliefs
 - 8 "grace" being a theological construct with several sub constructs and permutations
 - ℵ "the" vs. "a" articles in Scripture
 - & Allah being an ungodly name for GOD, Yahweh, or Elohim
 - ℵ Her name as Mary, His name as Jesus, his name as Joseph, or Peter's name as "Cephas" soft c

TIPS FOR BEING BETTER TEACHER—

- A. Manage the pedagogical environment
 - ✓ Questions sought
 - ✓ Space facilitates your instructional goals
- B. Come early (I came to prep for tonight on March 25). You can't expect students to be on time if you're not there to greet them.
- C. Even though the Scripture says a teacher will be held to a higher standard (James 3:1), maintain your self-confidence.
- D. Ignore those who say: "Those who can, do. Those who cannot, teach."
 - No Mark Spitz, the great Olympic swimmer, had a coach who could not swim. Teaching is a different skill set, requiring diverse values, and seeking vastly different results.
 - N Your job is to coach believers to be even better than you.
 - A. You are held to a higher standard—His standard.
 - B. Humility is the foundation of effective, *Biblical* teaching.
 - C. You are assessed not by your success, but by your student's success!
